

Dybvad/Lucht Memorial Scholarship

The Dybvad/Lucht Memorial Foundation scholarship program (formerly known as the Molalla Rotary Foundation Scholarship) is for Molalla area high school seniors who are planning to attend college. A number of general scholarship awards will be awarded, **as funds are available**. In addition, an agricultural based scholarship (Craig Lucht Memorial) will be awarded to a student pursuing a career in the field of agriculture.

The Dybvad/Lucht Foundation scholarship program is sponsored by the Molalla Rotary Club. It is funded by donations from the Molalla Rotary Club, the Lucht Family, as well as individuals from our community. The foundation was started over 25 years ago by a generous donation from Tom & Sally Dybvad.

The Foundation board consists of 4 members: Ilene Waldorf, Mitch Magenheimer, Ed Stafford and Wally Walker. These members are responsible for managing the Foundation funds, determining how many scholarships can be awarded each year and selecting the scholarship recipients.

The scholarships will be presented at the Senior Awards Program in May. If an award winner is not a student at Molalla High School, alternative arrangements will be made for presentation.

1. Write an autobiographical sketch that includes a description of your work experience, (not to exceed two pages).
2. List your career goals and your reason(s) for your interest in this area.
3. List the activities in which you have participated during your high school years. Include participation in clubs, committees, offices in school and community.
4. List the honors and awards that you have received in your school or your community.
5. List the schools(s) to which you have applied and been accepted.
6. Why should we award this scholarship to you?
7. Submit a transcript that includes your grades through the 2nd trimester of this year and your SAT/ACT scores to date.
